The candidate must also skate to the music and utilize the ice surface. As specified in rule 6531, the following elements are required:

JUMP ELEMENTS (5)	<b>Four different single or allowable** double jumps</b> two of which must be chosen from single Lutz, single Axel, double toe loop or double Salchow*					
	<b>One two-jump or three-jump combination or sequence**</b> including two jumps with at least one rotation					
SPINS (3)	<b>Three spins of a different character</b> -Minimum 4 revolutions each spin -If spin has a change of foot: minimum 4 revs. on each foot					
	<b>One step sequence (may include moves in the field and spirals)</b> must be visible and identifiable and use almost the full ice surface					
<b>Duration: 2:40 maximum</b> - For up to every 10 sec in excess: penalty of one point (-1) deduction (rule 6234 (A)) - For each illegal element/movement: penalty of one point (-1) deduction (rule 6234 (B))  *Required jumps may be performed as solo jumps, or as part of jump combinations or sequences, but no jump element may count for more than one of the jump requirements. **Allowable double jumps are double toe loop and double Salchow.  - Extra elements may be added without penalty. - Two different elements may be reskated, if necessary.			<b>MARK</b> (-3 to +3)
